WHAT IS A FAMILY VISION?

Proverbs 29:18 reminds us, "Where there is no vision, the people perish."

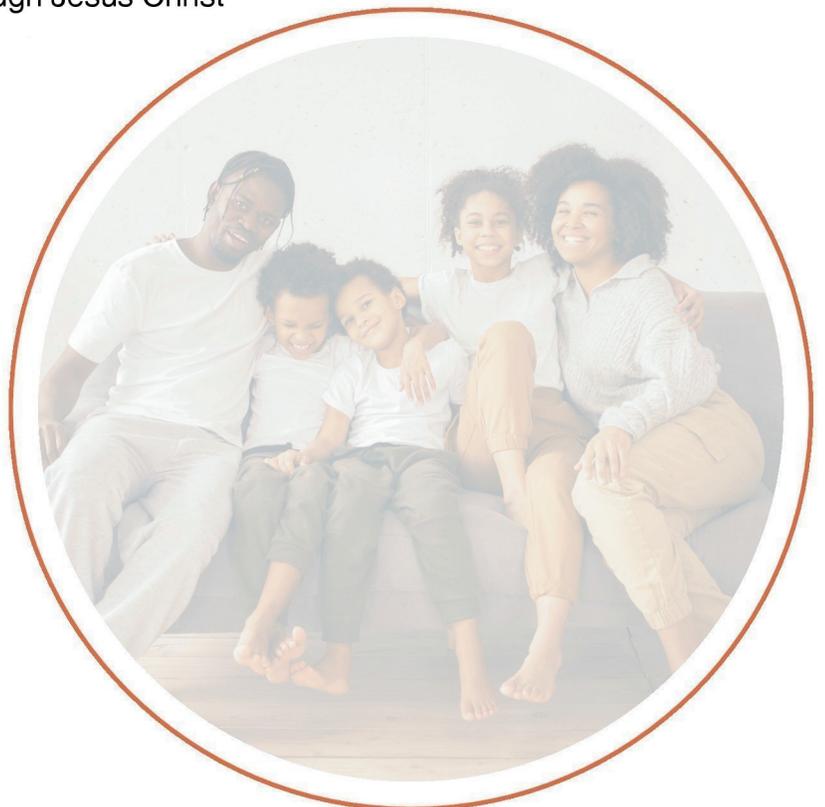
Our prayer is that this time strengthens your relationships, sharpens your focus, and helps you move forward with faith and intention.
